You've probably heard of, or even been treated at Palomar Hospital in nearby Escondido. But did you know that they also have several non-medical collaborative community health initiatives? Some of these agencies operate within the primary hospital and some operate outside the hospital, serving Fallbrook and all North County. Operating under the Palomar Home Health District umbrella, are the "Home Caregivers," "Home Health Services," and "Lifeline Medical Alerts." Home Health Care is currently the only four-star home health agency in San Diego County. They are accredited by the Joint

They also offer a "Rides with Care" program, providing transportation services to and from the hospital, physician appointments and/or prescription pickups.

Home Health Services: After an illness or injury, Palomar Home Health Services can bring licensed and certified healthcare attendants to you in the comfort of your own home. They can provide skilled nursing care for issues like wound management, pain management, diabetic or Ostomy management. They also can provide Ambulatory Care, Behavioral Services, Physical Therapy, Speech Therapy, Occupational Therapy, and Social Work. Lifeline Medical Alert Services: Lifeline offers an affordable way to summon help at home at the push of a button. They require no long-term contracts and are available with or without a landline.
