

The summer of 2025 was very difficult for my wife and me. As we move closer to our nineth years on this planet (no, we're not nearly there yet) we have begun to witness the passing of some of our dear friends. I know some of you are in the same place a us, but this summer brought it more into focus. We lost three friends in the same month. One we had known for nearly forty years, and two that we didn't meet until we moved to Fallbrook about twelve years ago. It was a very sad month for us, as well as for their families and their other friends.



But there was something with the loss of all three that became very evident when we attended the Celebration of Life for each of them. We didn't know them as well as we thought we did. The enlightenment came as a result of those Celebrations of Life.

The first was for a friend that we had known for a little over thirty years. She lived on the same street we used to live on in Laguna Niguel. We had attended many dinners and holiday celebrations over the years with her and her family and with many others on the street. After reading her life story we realized that we only knew one small portion of her life. Her two children that we had seen when they were small were now young adults who obviously inherited their parents' intelligence and are now also pursuing their own scientific careers.

The second was for a friend here who we met at the Senior Center and who was active in one of the other non-profit organizations in town. Again we were amazed when we read how much she had accomplished and how many her interests mirrored ours. And again we realized that we had only known one small portion of her life.

The third was for a dear friend who we had also met through the Senior Center, but who we knew much more about because I had had the privilege of writing her life story, which was published in the Senior Chronicle several years ago. She was indeed a real renaissance woman and had a lifetime of incredible accomplishments. I have written life stories of a few of our members, but I haven't written any for several years now.

And that's when it dawned on me – I need to write many more life stories to get to know more of the people who are right here close to us. Not just for me but for the benefit of all the others here at the Center. I'm sure there are many, many other members of the Senior Center who have also led amazing lives. I decided that I should write as many of their stories as I can over the next few years.

I don't know if we can get all of them published or not, but at least the stories will be available for



the families of the subjects. If you would like your story written, just contact the administrative office at the center and add your name and contact information to the list. Whether for only 10 or 15 who are interested, or for all 531 of our current members, I will write them all, for as long as I can. We will establish a time and place to talk, and of course I will get each person's

approval before finishing any of the stories. Let's get to know each other better while we are still alive. Celebrate Life!



The center is a membership organization but has a goal to coordinate services, skills and knowledge to benefit our seniors in the wider community




