Make a Photo More Than a Great Picture, Make It a Story

A photo may be appealing because it is a beautiful, well-planned scene that is properly composed or an artistic composition. It can be a reminder of someone important to us or a memory of a trip we took. Sometimes a photo itself may not be anything special but it has an accompanying story that makes it special. But sometimes a photo can fall under more than one of these categories at the same time, making it extra special. The front cover photo of the September 2023 issue of Arizona Highways falls into this category. It is a beautiful, well composed photo accompanied by the photographer's story surrounding the shot. This photo reminded me of a similar photo I took years ago, at this very same spot, that has its own story (see photos below).

The Arizona Highways cover photo is of the Upper Antelope Canyon at Lake Powell, taken by photographer Randy Prentice while leading a photography workshop. There have been beautiful photos taken of slot canyons by great photographers over the years but his photo was different. The timing was such that the instant the sun moved directly above the slot canyon, it sent a ray of sunlight into the canyon, lighting the swirling sand stone walls while appearing to burn a hole in the sand at the very bottom. The following is a small portion of a much greater story behind the photo I took at this same location years ago.

My family and I were on a camping trip at Lake Powell, California. The Upper Antelope Canyon is on Indian land and therefore required a reservation with the local Indian tribe to visit the canyon. We met our guide at the assigned time and place and climbed into the back of a pickup truck equipped with two parallel benches and a canopy overhead. Our guide drove us to a spot near the canyon entrance and led us on a hike into the canyon. Our tour group consisted of my family, myself and four photographers for a total of ten people. We had hiked to the end of the canyon and turned around to head back out. I stayed behind with the other photographers who were taking turns photographing the canyon. After the photographers finished taking their photos, they headed back out of the canyon. I stayed back to take a few more photos without people in them and noticed the light





in the canyon was changing dramatically. I waited there, watching the changing light when suddenly, a cylindrical shaft of light came streaming into the canyon. I realized this was an opportunity for a great shot. Since it was somewhat dark in the canyon, a slow shutter speed on the camera was required. Without a tripod to steady the camera to avoid a blurry photo, I braced my shoulder against the canyon wall and took the shot. Having the patience to wait for some great light paid off. The resulting photo is one of my favorites of all the photos I have taken over the years. As a side note, people walking around in the area had stirred up just enough dust to help make the shaft of light visible. My photo was taken in the days of film, so at the time, I didn't know for sure what the quality of the photo was until after returning home and having the film developed. With today's digital cameras, there is no more waiting. The photo can be viewed immediately after taking it and if it didn't turn out as expected, another photo can be taken with the required adjustments to exposure and/or composition. The camera used was a Nikon F3HP using Kodachrome film with a Nikon 24mm, f2 manual focus lens.


